### INTERESTING FACTS ABOUT IRONCLAD

The BBCHS Robotic Team is beginning their fourth year of competition. The Academic Foundation is proud to be a loyal supporter of this top-notch team.

In the last two years, 20 graduating seniors have earned over \$5.3 million in scholarship offers.

Seven seniors have earned full or nearly full tuition scholarships. One teammate was named the 2017 Engineering Student of the Year at Purdue University.

In three years, members have earned 13 internships with e2i, Fermilab, Midewin, BASF Academy, NUCOR, and GE.

The team donates over 1,100 volunteer hours annually.

The Ironclad/Robotics team helped start five new teams in the area over a three year period.

BBCHS Robotics Team is the most decorated regional team out of the 450 teams that started in 2015-16.

Sixty-three students engineered 4 robots last year!

### KYLE WERREMEYER

Kyle Werremeyer was a member of the boys' swimming and diving team from 1992-94. In his career, Kyle was a 3-Year varsity letterman, 2-time MVP award winner, and 2time team captain. Kyle was also a member of the 3-time IHSA Sectional Team runners-up, 3-time SICA South Conference Team Champions, and a 3-year undefeated SICA South Team Dual Meet Record. He was a 10-time Boys' Swimming and Diving SICA South Champion, 10-time IHSA Sectional Champion, and 10-time IHSA State Qualifier. At the time of his graduation, Kyle held 19 class, school, pool, conference and sectional records, two of which still stand today. Following his graduation, Kyle was a scholarship swimmer at Towson State University in 1994-95 and finished his career on scholarship at Northern Illinois University from 1995-1999.






