Foundation Classroom Grants Fall 2022

With support from generous Foundation donors, thirty thousand dollars is allocated annually for Classroom Grants. The 2022-23 fall grants include: \$13,000 for Heart Rate Assessment IT for PE Health & Wellness, \$1,500 for Gift Cards for the APEX Online Incentive Program, \$600 for an Independent Reading Library for English, and \$503 for a Cricut Machine for the Special Education Community Based Instruction program. In December, staff will have a second opportunity to apply for a classroom grant.


